Hebrews 5:14 reads, "But solid food is for the mature, for those who have their powers of discernment trained by constant practice to distinguish good from evil." Discernment entails cultivating the habit of parsing truth from error. It's the propensity to see the real issue behind the surface-level one. Here's what I mean.

Imagine that there's a fictional book geared for kids that tells the story of an "Uncle Joe" who had been married three times because "he couldn't find the right woman."
